FAQ's

Crossroads receives monies from my church, so why would we give in addition to that?

We want our donors to know that we respect and appreciate every amount donated, large or small. We will not make judgments about who can and cannot give. We want the communities of Crawford to know that to operate effectively, the accumulation of annual giving by groups, individuals, and churches is necessary.

Most churches are challenged to meet their own budget and many are shrinking in numbers. Carrying the financial weight of Crossroads' annual budget, even if collectively, would be unrealistic. We encourage you to review the 2018 annual report to see how our annual budget needs extend well beyond the combined giving at this time.

If you appreciate our mission and the fact that we serve all families with Christian resourcing and support at times that finding resources is difficult, and are in a position to share through donation, please consider us as a giving option according to your ability.

How does Crossroads apply monetary donations?

Our goal is to raise money for all overhead including rent, office supplies/equipment, and professional expenses. This way, monetary donations can be directly applied to TIME with families or individuals.

We are growing ways to produce income through our coffee sales, can & bottle redemption, and Sparrow's Nest Sales to offset the overhead and operational costs.

Why Does Crossroads not do more of the specialized services you have mentioned as possibilities as a means of income?

We hope to increase the time we have for specialized services to families such as adoption consultation, family mediation, and home studies. However, the large increase in time these services demand actually blocks effective work until we have adequate staff to help offset and manage the flow during the busy time. Any professional service requires effective paperwork, billing, and clerical management.

Did you know?

Jumpy Monkey Roasting in Sergeant Bluffs purchases their beans for roasting from Mexico, Colombia, Guatemala, Sumatra, Papa New Guinea, El Salvador, and sometimes Kenya. Their decaf variety is either Colombian or Brazilian, both are decaffeinated using a water process. They purchase from the same coffee farmers so that they can assure the quality and know who they are purchasing from as they roast specialty blends for us to enjoy!

CHURCH SPOTLIGHT -THANKING THE CHURCHES WHO OFFER CROSSROADS' SUPPORT

Immanuel Lutheran in Schleswig (LCMS) has played several significant roles in Crossroads' work. Pastor Merle Mahnken has been very helpful in providing direct visiting with some of the families that have come to Crossroads, and has referred folks to Crossroads as an extra source of help. The dual support to a person in a rough spot is more anchoring than without it.

We are grateful for Immanuel being a part of our core, as well as their inclusion of us in their budget.
