Ridiculous Giving

When I was elementary age, I remember going to a charity auction. As the piles of donated items from quilts to commemorative quarters and doilies to power washers dwindled down, I left my friends to return to my ride home, my dad. There was a whole new round of auctioning over something I had completely missed in my initial scan: Ice cream. I listened curiously to the fast rhythm of the auctioneer, not believing I was hearing right. Then he shouted 'SOLD to farmer Jones for \$300!' I was in disbelief and confusion. How could that be, \$300 for a single ice cream cone???

As I looked up at my dad he handed me popcorn. He smiled and said I'd better enjoy it as it had cost \$25 for that small bag of a few handfuls. On the way home I was asking about the ridiculous bidding. He explained that when the money is going to something people believe in, they just enjoy giving in this fun way.

Fast forwarding a few decades into my life, and I have seen this principle at work over and over again—people are generous as they can individually be for a cause they believe in and offer a price—maybe within range of the actual value, and oftentimes at a ridiculous price, with a smile on their face.

And because of God being at work, we are seeing it happen for Crossroads! This newsletter will share a few examples, and an opportunity to engage in Crossroads' outreach in generous and creative ways in order to build a community resource we very much need. Four years ago, we started reaching out to the ears and hearts of our

neighbors who were in need or who were looking for creative Christian solutions, perhaps new hope, or just someone to talk to. Very quickly, we knew that the need would prove itself many times over. The outreach was a means through which Christians could unite toward community helping.


family, or who don't know where to go for help. Then we walk their path with them as they choose, and perhaps creatively work toward solutions with them.

A pregnancy can be difficult or untimely for 100 or more different reasons. Decisions will need to be made about this crisis in their life, or about moving on with life. Change, loss, fear, relationships, emotions, and hopes are all factors that will be woven together in the matter of 9 months.

FAQ'S ABOUT LIFE LAUNCH GRANT

Will receiving the Life Launch grant reduce your other services?

Actually, we are hopeful for just the opposite. While we need volunteer and paid staff fully engaged with the mission of the crisis pregnancy services, we believe that the foundational pieces (policy, procedure, legal angles, administration, community development) will ALSO allow for our ongoing services in the other areas. In other words, the core work would very similar for all of our areas, and our mission statement was developed in a manner that focusing in on any particular service would still cover the others.

That being said, we will have to make decisions about prioritizing even more than we already do now with inadequate staffing. We do need to assure that we fully attend to the crisis pregnancy families as we state in the grant proposal. It is our prayer that the community will also see the value to the other services, and how they also affirm LIFE as God designed, and that the funding will continue to grow for more staff for those services.

Why would Heartbeat International only offer a matching grant instead of giving money for startup as a crisis pregnancy center?

Heartbeat International knows that growing a successful crisis pregnancy center will require committed donors who are willing to maintain the resource through repeated giving. Just as all of us plan to return to the grocery store for groceries or go to a gas station to refuel our vehicles, Crossroads is asking for DONORS, VOLUNTEERS, and PRAYER SUPPORT to maintain our mission—now as we raise \$30,000 and ongoing as we continue to serve and the numbers probably grow because more staff are needed.

You have described being a Pregnancy Resource Center since onset of Crossroads. How is this different?

When Crossroads started, we knew this was an unmet need in our area. We wanted to offer something for young people seeking help with the decisions involved surrounding an untimely pregnancy. Janette Clausen, Director, was comfortable giving what she could because of over 30 years in pregnancy counseling and adoption work. Heartbeat International is a worldwide network of more than 2,700 pro-life pregnancy help organizations. Receiving their accreditation means we have solid foundational materials, excellent resources, networking with other centers, professional support, and tools to build the vision into a more effective and comprehensive program, complete with trained staff to consistently be present to respond.

Additionally, a crisis pregnancy center versus a resource center ALSO has pregnancy testing and ultrasound (non-medical diagnosing) available, and this goal has also been desired and started upon here for Crossroads by involved community churches and individuals.
