Our project is GOD-SIZED in our humanness, yet not even a miracle in His view! Our constituents from previous connection with our ministry will recall the most recent previous capital campaign named 'God's Itty Bitty & Great Big'. That was to raise monies for professional staffing and training before we knew we would be engaging in a campaign for the ultrasound program. Itty Bitty feet carry GREAT BIG PROMISE with God's plans!



IMPOSSIBLE is GOD'S STARTING POINT

And He certainly delivered MORE THAN WE IMAGINED! God is so good! He knew we would have been intimidated to do this current fundraising without first success at \$100,000 toward the wages for paid staff we need with the right heart for our ministry! Now, He is calling us to prepare an ultrasound center where we can better help toward AFFIRMING LIFE FROM IT'S EARLIEST START. He knew perfectly how to orchestrate the events over this past year so that they culminated into this plan.

Building payoff/Operations


PHASE IV GOAL: \$150,000

WHY a new site?

We've outgrown our current rented space! We were limited in what we can offer because of no group area, just two private office spaces, and staff filling the others! We had talked of several key advantages to owning space even before we knew God would put ultrasound availability into our near future. The offer by the Knight of Columbus to equip us with an ultrasound machine springboarded us into seeking new space.



The news is out! Crossroads closed on a new site—we are doing some light remodel and installing a safety system currently for about 1/3 of the total space.

It's not about a great new office space - it's about SERVING LIFE, SAVING LIFE, and LIVING LIFE!





AND most importantly, there will be a great space for an ultrasound area, which includes a counseling room and medical staff office—and an ultrasound machine or course!




WHY an ultrasound machine?

Are there other staff needs that Crossroads has?

Yes! There is need for professional staffing, who of course CAN be volunteer, but we try to balance a budget available for them so when they are ready WE ARE TOO!

While we certainly could put most every helper to work, the reality is that we cannot oversee so many helpers and still be efficient in what needs to get done with the mission. So, we are hopeful for experienced professional staff who can fulfill several roles and be independent workers within their roles.

These include:

Part Time Medical Staff

- **Medical Director** (MD or NP) to lead the ultrasound program and to provide professional supervision, oversight, and assure policy and procedural compliance
- **Sonographer**—our ultrasounds will be PERFORMED by licensed and qualified sonographers. However, we will not be READING or diagnosing ultrasound results. All positive pregnancy test patients will be referred to obstetric care through existing local providers. We would love a small pool of available options so that if they work full time elsewhere, it does not necessitate regular time off when we hold ultrasound days.
- **Nurse**—engage in direct communication and education with clients toward healthy pregnancy and parenting. We prefer a small pool of available options so that if they work full time elsewhere, it does not necessitate regular time off when we hold ultrasound days

Administrative Office Management—from granting work to fielding calls, and juggling technology, to oversight on the software on which we rely, to comfortably adding a hand to development and relations, we can run much more efficiently!

Administrative Assistant Director with intention for mentoring into an Executive Director position over time, according to training, experience, and skills.

Building Manager troubleshooting, basic maintenance, orchestration of professional technical services for the space.

ANSWER:

The Nurse Manager position! It is not listed here because we have made a new hire for the Ultrasound Nurse Manager Position! Meet Stephanie King!



Stephanie's role will be chief oversight and management of how the ultrasound service flows. She will ensure any materials, forms, and procedures are within protocol. Greeting and acquainting with patients will be an important piece, as she would oversee their referrals to any other professionals and follow up on their overall goals and plan that they may have. Stephanie will report to the Medical Director, assure file maintenance, and be a huge piece of education for the patients. She will also do the clinic date scheduling and the personnel management of the medical team.

It is a lot of important tasks, and the sum total is that she will be key in helping Crossroads to carry out their mission. She is vital to the pro-life, pro-LIVING commitment we will protect and carry out in our day-to-day encounters with our clientele—who are typically scared, overwhelmed, confused, and shamed into thinking they are not good enough or are 'damaged goods'.

Here is what Stephanie shared about herself and her new role:

My name is Stephanie King. My husband, Mick King, and I live on an acreage outside of Wall Lake where we are raising our two children, a 9 year old boy, Jase, who is currently a 3rd grader at East Sac and a 5 year old girl, Kaelly, who is in TK. Mick is the sales manager at Rex Chevrolet GMC in Odebolt, Jase is involved in whatever sport is in season (basketball at the current moment), and Kaelly is in dance and tumbling and always wondering when she'll be old enough to do whatever Jase is doing. We love living in our small community close to all of our family and the wide open spaces we have living in the country.

I obtained my Associates Degree in Nursing in 2003 from St. Luke's College in Sioux City and then my Bachelors of Science in Nursing in 2005 from Morningside College. In my twenty years of nursing I have worked in a variety of areas including Oncology, Clinic nursing, Home Health/Hospice/Public Health nursing, and Early Childhood/School nursing. The last 5 years I have dedicated to staying home with my children who are growing up much too quickly

for my liking. I also teach 12th grade faith formation for our church and it has been such a blessing in my life. In my spare time I love to read (I usually have a minimum of 3 books going at one time), watch anything "feel good" on Netflix, and I especially love spending time with my family and watching the interests of my children grow.

I am excited to work for an organization where I can use my faith and my medical skills to provide holistic care to all who walk through our doors. I love children and my favorite "job" and title over the years has been being a mother. I feel it to be a privilege to be even a small support for any woman or couple facing an unplanned pregnancy and to show them and their unborn child the respect, care, and dignity they deserve as children of God. I hope to extend the love of Jesus to each person I come in contact with in order to offer them hope and empowerment when faced with difficult circumstances. God intended us for community and no one should have to feel alone or abandoned during the most vulnerable times of their lives.

Also meet another new staff person, Isabelle!

She joined us in September and is dabbling in learning both service areas of Crossroads. When we get into the new site, she will field most all clients who come by according to their needs as well as serve some directly herself. Isabelle plans to reduce her hours some to attend Liberty University online this upcoming semester. She is planning for a Bachelors in Biblical & Theological Studies and then to earn her Masters in Applied Ministry. She is learning about development and fundraising through Heartbeat International. You may have noticed her friendly note and signature on a thank you note recently! We team each gift to assure a thank you and receipt is given, and that it is recorded correctly.

Her spunk, love for family, and passion to serve God are a great fit for Crossroads. Her desire to SERVE LIFE is a natural attribute. Here is what she shared: “Since September when I started, I have loved it here at Crossroads! I was drawn to their love for life, wanting to help others in the community and to help grow and strengthen families. I am so excited to get our ultrasound center going so we have more resources, room, options, and services for our families. In my free time I love to work on art projects, play the piano, make jewelry and try a new recipe.”

Ohhhhh, yes, of course! We plan to 'pour' more time into Jumpy Monkey Specialty whole bean and ground coffee again! When we move to the new site, it seems that will be a perfect time to 'grind' that. We have lots of fun coffee ideas 'perking' but just need to focus on the ultrasound center first, in addition to mentoring and assisting our young parents we serve. Unless.... YOU step in to help 'roast' up some new volunteer energy into the coffee sales!

Did you know... Jumpy Monkey uses 100% Arabica beans from the same farmers in the same countries including *Columbia, South America, Guatemala, Mexico, Papua New Guinea, & Sumatra*. This is important to them to assure they are supporting the farmer who is caring for his family AND they get the same product to roast in their roastery in Sergeant Bluff, Iowa. We are grateful to Lori Bride, owner and operator of the roastery, who has consistently sent us coffee at a discount they provide so we can resale for profit to the Pregnancy & Parenting Resource Center, and NOW also the ULTRASOUND center!

Why the Phases of the Ultrasound Project?

The phases help make it easier to understand the whole project and its timeframe. Our priority is the ultrasound area and to utilize it, we needed more at the front end of the project. Once the building is paid, we can return to budgeting for staffing and operational expenses.

The Phase 1 goal of this project is the largest because it was needed to include the large downpayment on the new building plus necessary remodel to have compliance with safety (fire, surveillance, and entry).

Our new expenses toward the building and the ultrasound project imply COMMUNITY and those passionate FOR LIFE to help us succeed.

- Monthly purchase payments We have a 5 year contract for the purchase so we can work hard at the fundraising and then save on further interest that can better go into staffing the ministry needs.
- Remodel Expenses. Renovation was necessary to meet compliance with medical center setting, incorporate better safety, make accessibility to the clients with a variety of services, and maximize use of space available. Clients need for this to be a SAFE & INVITING place to come and to be comfortable sharing what is going on in their hearts and lives AND for us to be able to be a support in those circumstances. This includes having time with them at the center to mentor in parenting and relationships, and helping them learn new skills.
- Maintenance & repair for whole building (part time)—we have several furnaces, a big space to keep clean and tidy, and renters who will need repairs. So, we need a person and the finances to effectively manage this.

The phases DO NOT include our staffing salaries. Raising the monies is indeed a perpetual ‘way of life’ for our ministry, but please understand that until the 5 years before payoff are complete, we will need **extra fuel** for the liftoff!
